

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2025 Convention Meeting #3

July 3, 2024

 ${f T}$ his month I attended the third (I think) 2025 Convention meeting to discuss the upcoming Santa Maria event. As you are probably aware of, SFBA has committed to taking on the Parking monitoring task. I briefed the group on the effort we had already done, which is not much more than thinking of the issues we would face. I did confirm the overall plan we had in mind was correct but I have not personally seen the area that will be available so I have no idea about the actual layout. And I don't know who decides where to park which cars. One issue remains unanswered is whether or not an empty lot will be available for us to use (maybe for RV or trailer parking). The Planes Of Fame Air Museum is moving from Chino to Santa Maria and will eventually use this area.


For the actual Convention the

Autocross is planned for the far edge of the airport and because it is an active airport (with NTSB security), entrants would have to drive around the airport perimeter (about 1 mile). This was not thought to be an issue. For other Conventions the Autocross event has been 10 or so miles away. The EconoRun and Rally were initially planned around a 40 mile course which was less than the 50 to 60 miles of other Conventions. So, it may be re-thought. Larry Claypool said the distance was not a real issue but they need to be sure that it would start and end at a gas station that could accommodate all of the cars. For the Rally it was suggested that a trial run be made to be sure the instructions were followable. And the EconoRun should be in the morning followed by the Rally in the afternoon otherwise this adds a day to the Con-

vention.

The Convention is scheduled for four days (Tuesday through Friday) with most arrivals coming in on Monday and Tuesday. There are several non-Corvair activities scheduled (wine tasting, Herst Castle tour, and maybe a Solvang and Chumash Casino visit) for those that are not overly interested in our cars.

The Radison Hotel is being acquired by Marriot but they have confirmed the \$119/night room rate will stand (which is remarkable for California).














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
